Tobacco, Smoking Products and Electronic Smoking Products: Use (General Public)

Penalties

Members of the general public found in violation of Policy 1330 will be required to stop the prohibited activity and may also be asked to leave. Members of the general public found in violation of Policy 1330 may be subject to penalties as permitted under applicable Pennsylvania law.

Definitions

"Tobacco products" means:

- 1. Cigarettes
- 2. Cigars.
- 3. Electronic cigarettes.
- 4. Roll-your-own tobacco.
- 5. Periques, granulated, plug cut, crimp cut, ready rubbed and other smoking tobacco, snuff, dry snuff, snuff flour, cavendish, plug and twist tobacco, fine-cut and other chewing tobaccos, shorts, refuse scraps, clippings, cuttings and sweepings of tobacco and other kinds and forms of tobacco, prepared in such manner as to be suitable for chewing or ingesting or for smoking in a pipe or otherwise, or any combination of chewing, ingesting or smoking.

"Cigarette" means any roll for smoking made wholly or in part of tobacco, the wrapper or cover of which is made of any substance or material other than tobacco regardless of the size or shape of the roll and regardless of whether or not the tobacco is flavored, adulterated or mixed with any other ingredient or a little cigar.

"Electronic cigarettes" means an electronic oral device, such as one composed of a heating element and battery or electronic circuit, or both, which provides a vapor of nicotine or any other substance and the use or inhalation of which simulates smoking.

The term includes:

1. A device as described in paragraph (1), notwithstanding whether the device is manufactured, distributed, marketed or sold as an e-cigarette, e-cigar and e-pipe or under any other product, name or description.

2. A liquid or substance placed in or sold for use in an electronic cigarette

"Vaping" means to inhale vapor through the mouth from a usually batteryoperated electronic device (such as an electronic cigarette) that heats up and vaporizes a liquid or solid.
